

QUT Women in Engineering Scholarship

Terms and Conditions

Overview

The QUT Women in Engineering Scholarship is a merit scholarship valued at \$6,000, offered to commencing domestic Participants. This is provided to the Participant directly in the form of funds transfer to their nominated bank account.

These terms and conditions apply to Participants commencing the Scholarship in 2025. The Scholarship is offered from Semester 1, 2025.

Purpose

QUT is committed to growing the number of graduating women engineers and to fostering the view of engineering as a career of choice for women. The QUT Women in Engineering Scholarship will help build a cohort of future leaders in engineering professions.

1. Eligibility Requirements	To be eligible for the QUT Women in Engineering Scholarship, applicants must meet all of these requirements: 1. Must be graduating Year 12 in Australia (or International Baccalaureate) OR have had no more than one gap year since graduating high school (or International Baccalaureate). 2. Must identify as female. 3. Must be starting a university undergraduate degree for the first time. 4. Must fall into one of the categories below: a. An Australian or New Zealand citizen, OR b. A permanent resident of Australia, OR c. The holder of a permanent humanitarian visa. 5. Must nominate a QUT undergraduate degree as their first preference in the QTAC application process. 6. Must be applying for admission into one of the following degrees:
	 a. Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (EN01) b. Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) / Master or Robotics and

2. Application and selection criteria	 conditions, detailed within the governing terms and conditions related to the applicable scholarship or bursary. 1. The QUT Women in Engineering Scholarship requires no application form. Scholarships recipients will receive this scholarship based on academic merit and/or other specific requirements, assessed on ATAR or equivalent (overseas qualification). Please review Eligibility requirements above. 4. QUT has discretion with any decisions made, in connection with this scholarship process. To the extent permitted by law QUT has no liability to any student for decisions made in relation to the Scholarship.
3. Value and payment of scholarship	 Scholarships valued up to \$6,000 are paid at \$3,000 per year for a full-time enrolment load for a maximum of two (2) years. Payments are made on a half-yearly basis (\$1,500 amount per semester/teaching period) and are disbursed the week after the census date of the enrolled semester/teaching period. For Participants who complete their study in accelerated mode (or before the terms of the Scholarships lapse), the remaining balance
	 of the Scholarship funds will be forfeited and will not be paid to the student. 6. Participants enrolled on a part-time (24 credit points or less) basis will receive 50% of the standard payment. 7. Payment will be subject to the Conditions below. If the Participants do not meet these Conditions payment may be suspended. 8. Participants will receive scholarship payment by electronic transfer to their nominated bank account after census date each semester/teaching period. 9. Participants enrolled in Exchange, Cross Institutional and BULA
	 semesters/semester/teaching periods will have different census dates. Payments will be made one week after the census date of these semester/teaching periods. 10. While every care is taken to ensure direct payment of scholarship funds are correct, Participants are required to monitor payments and notify scholarships@qut.edu.au of any over or under payments. 2. Overpayments: 11. If an overpayment occurs at any time and for any reason QUT may issue the Participant with a written notice requiring repayment of

	the amount overpaid ("Overpayment Notice"). a. The student must pay to QUT the amount of the overpayment specified in the Overpayment Notice within ten (10) business days of the date of the notice. b. QUT may, at its sole discretion, recover the overpayment specified in the Overpayment Notice from the student by offsetting that overpayment against any amount subsequently due to the student as part of their scholarship.
	3. Tax implications: QUT does not withhold PAYG tax from coursework scholarships payments. It is the recipient's responsibility to check the tax implications for your scholarship and personal circumstances. For advice on whether your scholarship is taxable, use the Additional tax information can be obtained via www.ato.gov.au/individuals.
	4. Centrelink: Please also note that Centrelink may include this scholarship entitlement in any means testing as a result of applications made for Commonwealth assistance. Please check the Centrelink site for information regarding exempt scholarships.
4. Term of scholarship	 The term of the Scholarship is determined by the student's enrolment load, either full-time or part-time (e.g., two (2) years for the \$6,000 award, based on a full-time enrolment). Participants are permitted to change to part-time enrolment if required. This may extend the terms of the Scholarship. Participants must remain admitted and enrolled in a course to receive their scholarship payment as per Conditions. For Participants who complete their study in accelerated mode before the term of the Scholarship ends, the remaining balance of the Scholarship funds will be forfeited and will not be paid to the student.
5. Conditions of Scholarship	 Participants must achieve a minimum course (cumulative) Grade Point Average (GPA) of 4.00 in any given semester/teaching period to maintain the Scholarship for the next study period. Special circumstances will be taken into consideration to support individual variation to the Conditions of the Scholarship. Supporting documentary evidence may be requested. Participants are encouraged to discuss their special circumstance with scholarships@qut.edu.au or Counselling services. Progression:
	 Participants whose course (cumulative) GPA drops below 4.00 are issued a notification that they are in breach of their scholarship condition but will continue to receive their payment for the currently enrolled semester/teaching period. If their course (cumulative) GPA remains below 4.00 for the following semester/teaching period, payment may be suspended until further notice.
	A third breach of the GPA condition may result in termination of the Scholarship.

	 Participants must remain admitted and enrolled in an eligible course to receive their scholarship payment.
	5. Participants are not permitted to change their course.
	 Scholarship payments are suspended whilst a student is on an approved Leave of Absence. After completing their first semester/teaching period, Participants can apply for up to two years Leave of Absence from their course without impacting their scholarship.
	 Participants who withdraw from their studies prior to completion of the semester/teaching period (i.e., no grades are recorded) may be required to return monies paid.
	 Participants on the QUT Women in Engineering Scholarship cannot concurrently receive another merit, cooperative, or industry scholarship, but are eligible to receive a bursary, prize, or equity scholarship, while being a merit Participant.
	9. Unsuccessful applicants:
	a. QUT's decision in the awarding of a scholarship will be final.
	b. QUT is not liable for any:
	 indirect or consequential loss; and
	 any loss of revenue, loss of profit or loss of business opportunities, suffered by the student in connection with the Scholarship process whether under contract, tort (including negligence) or otherwise.
	11. The applicant/recipient accepts the Scholarship by doing the following:
	 Accept the Scholarship offer and agree to the declaration and terms and conditions in the online scholarship offer acceptance form by the date specified.
	a. Provide QUT with bank details.
	13. If the applicant/recipient does not accept the Scholarship by the date specified in the offer letter, the applicant/recipient will forfeit the Scholarship and QUT reserves the right to allocate the Scholarship to someone else.
6. Under 18	14. If the Scholarship applicant/recipient is under the age of 18 years, the applicant/recipient will be deemed to have obtained the permission of the applicant/recipient's parent or legal guardian to participate in the Scholarship application process and the Scholarship award and to be bound by these terms.
7. Termination of scholarship	The university reserves the right to cease a scholarship in the following circumstances:
	15. Failure to comply with the Conditions (5) of the Scholarship.
	16. Withdrawal from your course. Participants are advised to contact scholarships@qut.edu.au , Faculty, or Counselling services before withdrawing from their course.
	 Failure to enrol into a course following the completion of the approved deferral period.
	 Participants who commence a degree at another university will not be eligible for the Scholarship upon their return from deferment.
	19. Failure to enrol into a course following the completion of the

	approved Leave of Absence period. 20. Student behaviour that breaches the QUT Student Code of Conduct, where if proven would be regarded as student misconduct. The required standards of behaviour relate to policies regarding Academic integrity (MOPP C/5.3), QUT Code for responsible conduct of research (MOPP D/2.6), Acceptable use of information technology resources (MOPP F/1.11).
