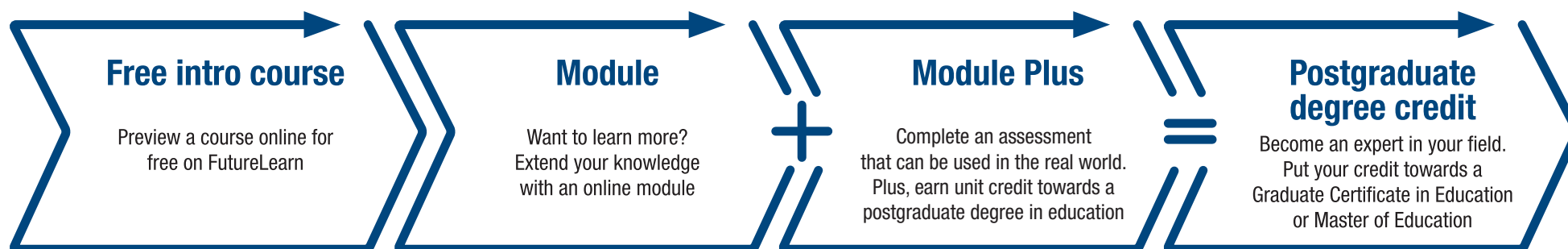

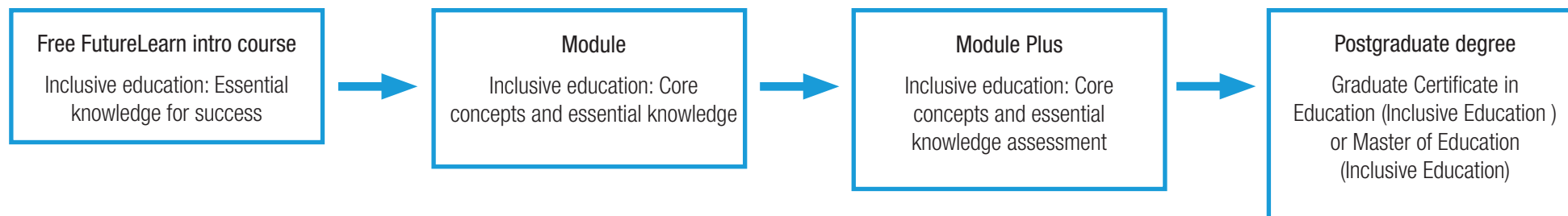

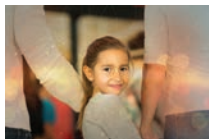
Teaching probability and maths: middle years
