

Your campuses and facilities

QUT has two inner-city, green campuses that put you in the middle of the action.

Gardens Point is in the heart of the city beside the Brisbane River (Maiwar) and City Botanic Gardens. Our Kelvin Grove campus is just three kilometres from the city. Both campuses offer food, entertainment, fitness and healthcare options for students.

Where you study will depend on the units you choose. Units in architecture and built environment, business, engineering, some health disciplines, information technology, law, mathematics and science are offered at Gardens Point. Kelvin Grove campus is home to units in communication, creative arts, design, education, health and justice, as well as our English and pathway programs at QUT College.

Choosing your QUT units

QUT offers a wide range of disciplines that align with your studies at your home institution.

You can choose to study at QUT for one or two semesters, beginning either Semester 1 (February to June) or Semester 2 (July to November). Most QUT units are valued at 12 credit points each. As a guide, a 12 credit point QUT unit is usually equal to 4 US credits, 7.5 ECTS or 15 UK credits.

A standard full-time study load at QUT is four units (48 QUT credit points or 30 ECTS) per semester and most QUT students study this amount. You can study a minimum of three units (36 credit points or 22.5 ECTS) and up to five units (60 credit points or 37.5 ECTS).





Accommodation

Our inner-city campus locations mean there is no shortage of accommodation options—some right on our doorstep.

And with a great public transport network including buses, trains and ferries—as well as a free intercampus shuttle—getting around is easy too.

To help get you settled, our Accommodation Services team provides information about student accommodation and a vacancies database, as well as advice about finding the right place.

Student apartment complexes

These complexes offer self-catering in a single apartment or a room within a larger apartment. They are fully furnished and provide a supported student community. Cost per week is approximately AU\$550 for a single apartment or AU\$399 for a room in a larger apartment.


Catered student accommodation

This accommodation is available through student residential colleges, which also offer a community environment. Cost per week is between AU\$600 and AU\$770.

Private share house accommodation

Share-house accommodation provides you with your own fully furnished, lockable bedroom and shared common areas such as bathroom, kitchen and living area. They are managed by real estate agents or other companies specialising in student accommodation. Cost per week is from AU\$200. Private share houses are often prepared to negotiate lease durations (less than six months) and are sometimes even prepared to negotiate weekly rental rates. Utilities would not typically be included.

















Cost of living

Brisbane is an affordable city, and we want you to make the most of your time in Australia. See the tips below to get you started with planning a budget.

Getting settled

If you are moving to Brisbane, during your first few weeks you will need around AU\$2,500 to get established, including accommodation costs, money to set up your new home, food and transport.

Working while studying

A student visa typically allows you to work up to 48 hours per fortnight during semester. While this may allow you spending money, you should not expect this to cover your living expenses.

Tuition fees

Exchange students continue to pay their tuition fees to their home university. **Study abroad students** will need to study and pay for three to five units.

4 GET HOME UNIVERSITY APPROVAL

- If you are an exchange student you must be nominated by a QUT partner institution. Your home university's international office will be able to help you with your study options.
- If you are a study abroad student, you can apply online directly to QUT or through an authorised education agency in your home country.

2 CHECK THE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

You must:

- have a minimum GPA (grade point average) of 2.5 on a 4-point scale or equivalent
- have completed at least one year of full-time study at a recognised institution
- be nominated by one of our partner institutions (exchange only)
- meet the English language requirements if English is not your first language or if you have not undertaken a course taught entirely in English.

? CHOOSE YOUR UNITS

Choose the units you will study at QUT. Choose a package of units or separate units from one or more study areas. Before choosing your units, make sure:

- the units are approved by your home university
- to choose units being offered in the correct semester (teaching period)
- you meet any prerequisite study requirements

- Applications for Semester 1 (February– July) are due on 2 January each year.
- Applications for Semester 2 (July– November) are due on 1 June each year.

5 SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION ONLINE

- Exchange students will receive application information once your home university and QUT have both approved you to apply.
- Study abroad students must apply online directly to QUT or through an approved education agency.

O UPLOAD YOUR SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS WITH YOUR APPLICATION

- Passport (must be valid for six months after your study at QUT finishes).
- Most recent academic transcript (in English).
- English language proficiency test, or equivalent (if required).

7 WHAT HAPPENS AFTER YOU APPLY?

- If eligible, we will issue you with an offer to study at QUT.
- Once you accept your offer, we will send you a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) document, which you can use to apply for a student visa for entry into Australia.
- Study abroad students will be directed to a payment portal to finalise their study abroad fees.
- We recommend applying for your student visa as soon as you receive your CoE.
- All study abroad and exchange students must have adequate Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC). QUT can organise this for you through our preferred provider, Medibank.
