John R Saal was a lecturer in histopathology and established the medical science course at QUT. He was awarded a Churchill Fellowship in 1969. In 1970 he became Head of the Department of Paramedical Studies at QUT, and then in 1977 became Head of the School of Health Science. John held many offices within AIMS, including Branch and National President, and was National Registrar at the time of his death in 1979. Each year, there is a prestigious lecture named in his honour given at the AIMS National Scientific Meeting.

This prize commemorates Dr Flecker's dedication to the field.
