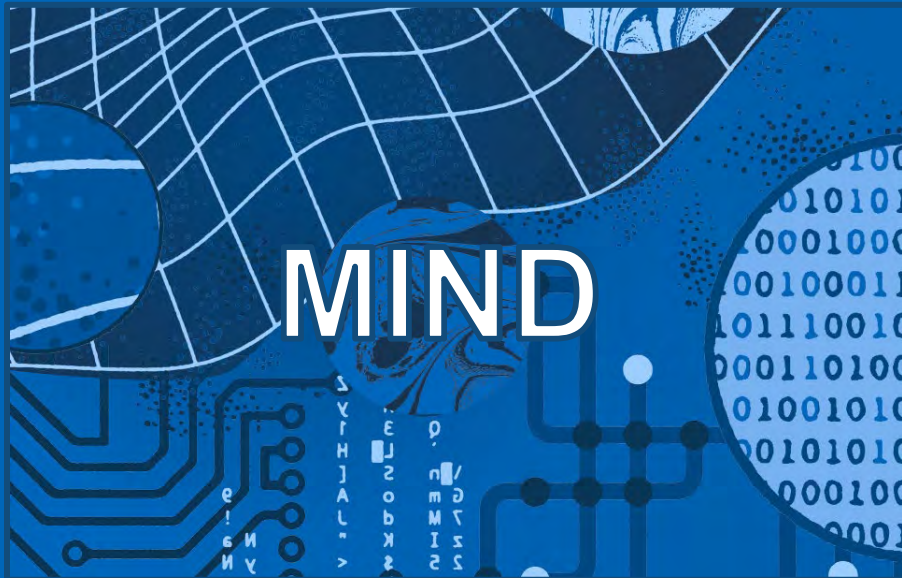
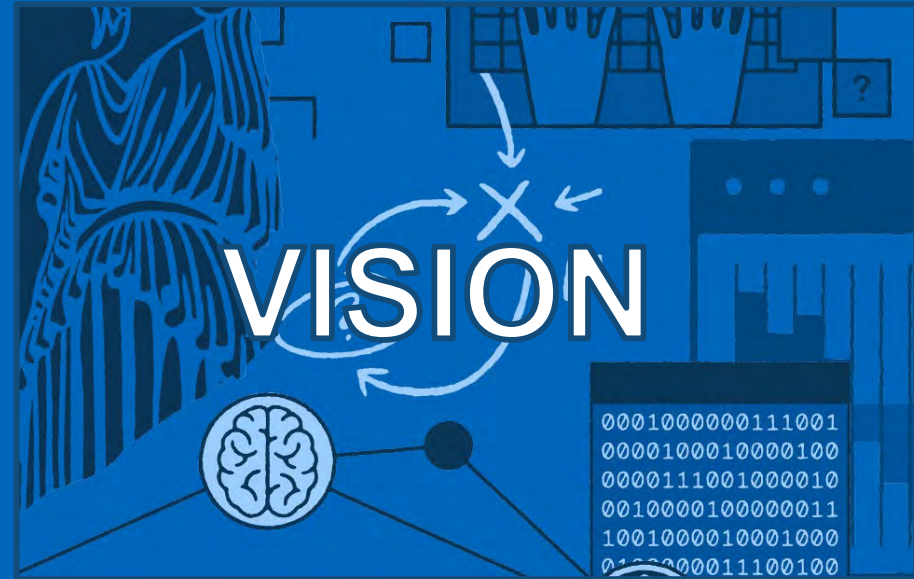
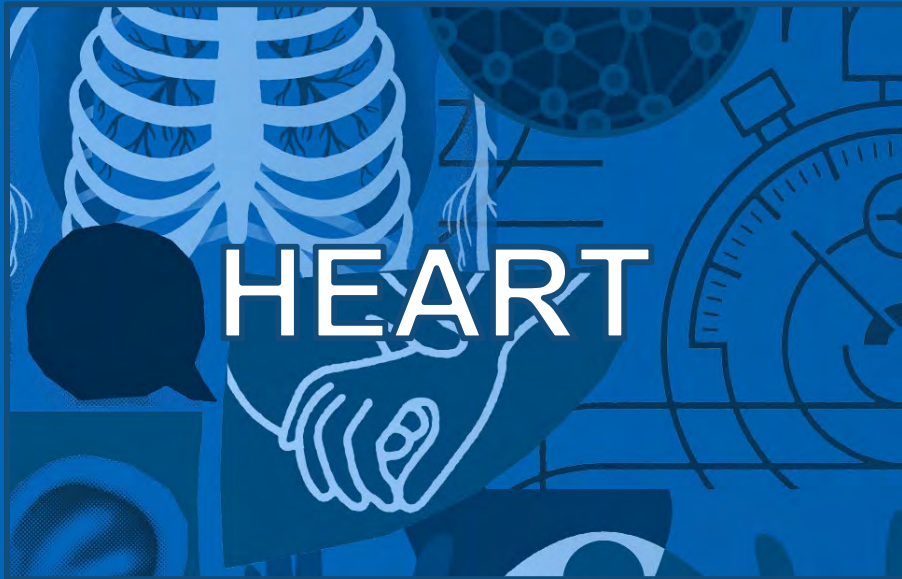

Decoding unispeak

QTAC	Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre Process all applications for Queensland tertiary study
ATAR	Australian Tertiary Admission Rank Used to gain entry into tertiary study (99.95 is the highest ATAR)
Selection rank	Same scale as an ATAR but for applicants with different qualifications VET studies, past Year 12 results, or work experience
Threshold	The ATAR/selection rank to aim for if you're interested in the course (can change from year to year)

Decoding unispeak

Diploma or Undergraduate Certificate	Pathway program, completed within 6 months–1 year. Direct entry to a relevant bachelor degree upon completion.
Single degree	First study option at university (undergraduate) Normally takes around three to five years of full-time study
Double degree	A combination of two bachelor degrees that you study at the same time, graduating with two qualifications in 4–5.5 years.
Vertical double degree	A bachelor degree and master degree in a streamlined course of study, graduating with a postgraduate qualification and advanced knowledge in your specialist field in 5 years.

If you don't think your ATAR or selection rank is high enough to get into this course, you can guarantee your entry with guaranteed advanced standing by upgrading through one the following programs which you can select as one of your QTAC preferences:

QUT College Diplomas

As a QUT College Diploma in Business, Entrepreneurship (business pathway), or Esports (business pathway) graduate you will automatically receive an offer to start the Bachelor of Business within one week after completion of the diploma. You will also automatically receive up to 1.0 year (96 credit points) credit transfer and be able to complete the degree in 2 years as a full-time student (or equivalent part-time).

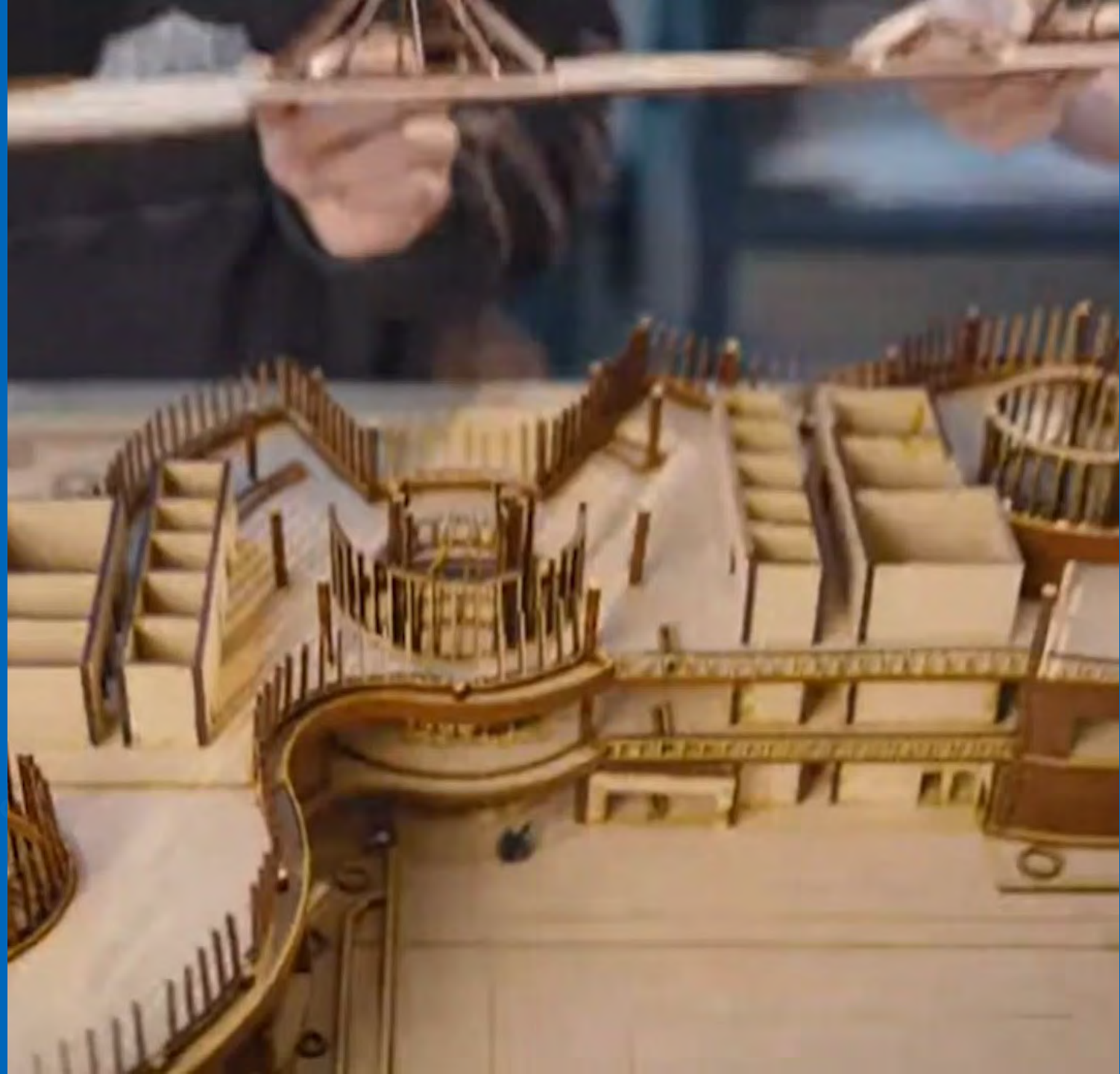

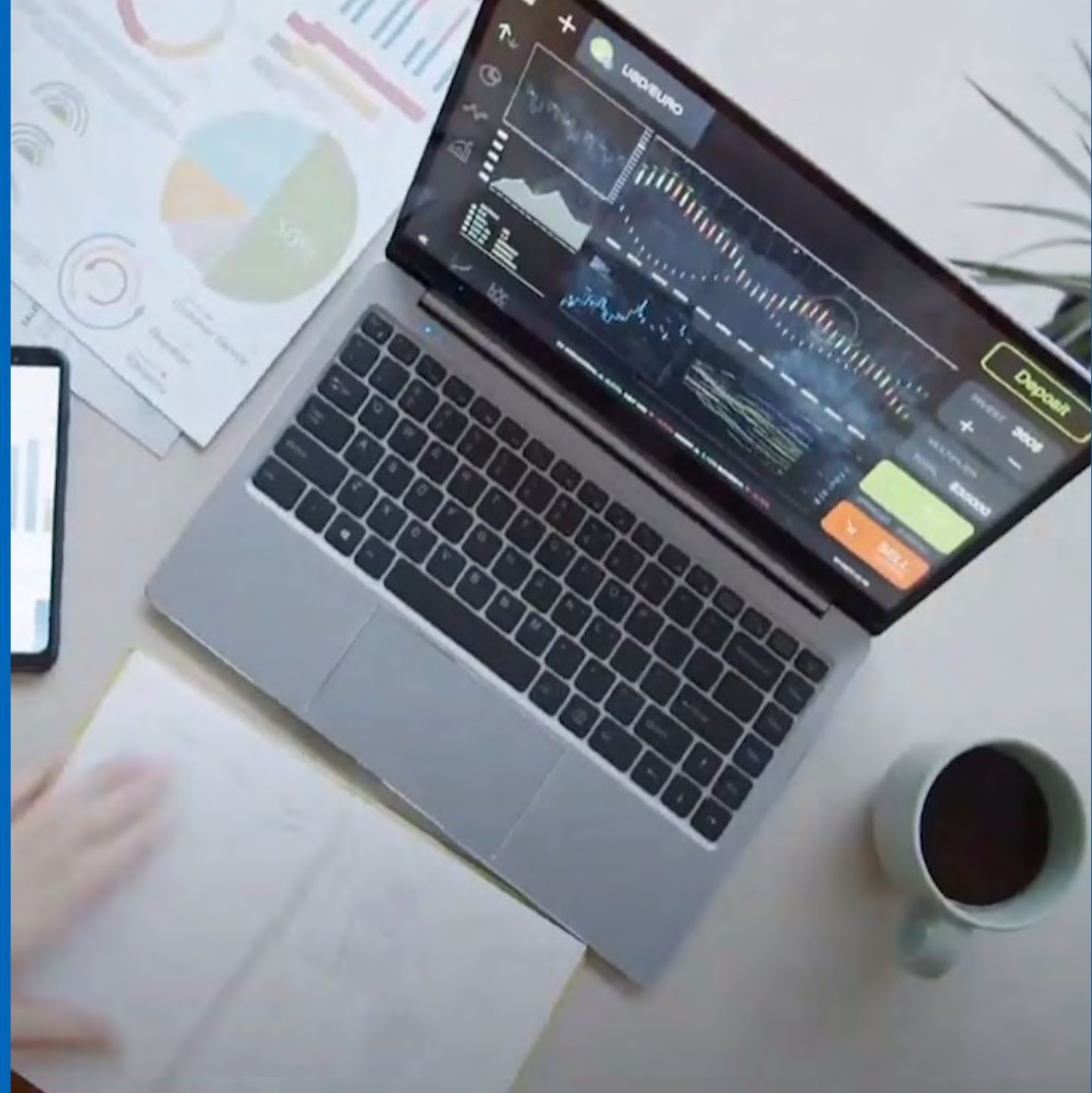
