

LCI Indigenous Engineering Scholarship

Terms and conditions

Overview

The LCI Indigenous Engineering Scholarship (*'the Scholarship'*) is an industry scholarship valued at \$30,150, offered to continuing domestic students. This is provided to the Participant via funds transfer to their nominated bank account.

These terms and conditions apply to Participants commencing the Scholarship in 2025. The Scholarship requires an application and is offered from Semester 1, 2025.

Purpose

The purpose of the Scholarship is to support and empower Indigenous students, integrating their engineering education with a respect for First Nations cultural knowledge and connection to Country.

The LCI Indigenous Engineering Scholarship reflects LCI Consultants' commitment to reconciliation by fostering meaningful engagement with Indigenous Australian students in engineering. LCI believes that increasing Indigenous participation in electrical and mechanical engineering is essential for creating innovative solutions that are informed by Indigenous perspectives and values.

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Part 1 Eligibility Requirements	 To be eligible for the Scholarship, Participants must satisfy the below eligibility requirements: Must be an Australian citizen OR an Australian permanent resident. Must be an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Person as defined under Section 5 of the <u>Confirmation of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Descent Policy</u> and have had a processing officer from the Oodgeroo Unit or Carumba Institute confirm Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander descent via the <u>Confirmation of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Descent (CATSID) procedure</u>. Must be enrolled as a full-time student at QUT (36 credit points or above per semester). Must be entering their second year having completed 96 credit points in one of the below <i>eligible award courses</i>: a. EN01 Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Electrical) b. EN01 Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Mechanical) d. EN01 Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Mechanical)

	4. QUT has discretion with any decisions made, in connection with this process. To the extent permitted by law, QUT has no liability to any Participant for decisions made in relation to the Scholarship.
Part 3 Value and Payment of Scholarship	1. Scholarships valued at \$30,150 are paid at \$10,050 per year for a standard full-time enrolment program (36 credit points or more) for a maximum of three (3) year. Payments are made twice yearly (\$5,025 per teaching period) and are disbursed the week after the census date of each teaching period.
	 For the purposes of these terms and conditions, <i>teaching period</i> means the Semester 1 and/or 2 teaching periods, or in instances where a program of study and instruction for a unit or award course takes place in a teaching period not designated as a Semester 1 and/or 2 teaching period, the first enrolled teaching period designated in Grouped Period 1 (Semester 1 Cluster) and/or the first enrolled teaching period designated in Grouped Period 2 (Semester 2 Cluster). Payments will not be made to Participants during the Summer Program, or any teaching periods designated in Grouped Period 3 (Summer Cluster), unless otherwise specified in the Scholarship offer letter. Participants who complete their studies in accelerated mode or before

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	the term of the Scholarship lapses will forfeit any remaining balance of the Scholarship.
	4. Payment is subject to the <i>Conditions of Scholarship</i> . If the Participant fails to adhere to the <i>Conditions of Scholarship</i> , payment may be suspended or terminated.
	5. Participants will receive payment by electronic transfer to their nominated bank account after the census date of each teaching period.
	6. Participants enrolled in Exchange, Cross Institutional, and/or Brisbane Universities Language Alliance (BULA) units will receive payment after the census date of the Exchange, Cross Institutional, and/or BULA units.
	7. The Participant may be offered a work placement with the Sponsor, including work experience and paid casual work.
	8. Whilst every care is taken to ensure payment is correct, Participants are required to monitor payments and notify the Scholarships team (<u>scholarships@qut.edu.au</u>) of any over or under payments.
	9. Overpayments:
	 a. If an overpayment occurs at any time and for any reason, QUT may issue the Participant with a written notice requiring repayment of the amount overpaid ('Overpayment Notice') b. The Participant must pay to QUT the amount of the averpayment
	 b. The Participant must pay to QUT the amount of the overpayment specified in the Overpayment Notice within ten (10) business days of the date of the Overpayment Notice.
	c. QUT may, at its sole discretion, recover the overpayment specified in the Overpayment Notice from the Participant by offsetting that overpayment against any amount subsequently due to the Participant as part of their Scholarship.
	10. Taxation: QUT does not withhold PAYG tax from coursework scholarship, bursary, or prize payments. It is the Participant's responsibility to check the tax implications for their scholarship, bursary, or prize and personal circumstances. Participants are encouraged to use the <u>Australian</u> <u>Taxation Office's scholarship decision tool</u> . For more information, visit <u>www.ato.gov.au/individuals</u> .
	11. Centrelink: Centrelink may include this Scholarship entitlement in any means testing for applications made for Commonwealth assistance. Participants are encouraged to check the Centrelink website for information regarding exemptions.
Part 4 Term of Scholarship	1. The term of the Scholarship will be for three (3) years, based on a standard full-time enrolment program.
Part 5 Conditions of Scholarship	 Participants must achieve a minimum course (cumulative) grade point average (GPA) of 4.50 in any given teaching period to maintain the Scholarship for the next teaching period. Progression:
	a. Participants whose course (cumulative) GPA drops below 4.50 will be issued a notification that they are in breach of the <i>Conditions of Scholarship</i> but will continue to receive payment for the currently enrolled teaching period.
	b. If the Participant's course (cumulative) GPA remains below 4.50

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	for the following teaching period, the Scholarship may be suspended until further notice. c. A third academic breach may result in the termination of the Scholarship.
	3. Participants must remain admitted and enrolled in an eligible award course to receive payment. See <i>Eligibility Requirements</i> for the definition of eligible award course.
	 Participants are not permitted to change their award course and continue to receive the Scholarship, unless otherwise specified in the Scholarship offer letter.
	5. Deferment of the Scholarship offer is not permitted.
	 Payments are suspended whilst a Participant is undertaking an approved Leave of Absence. After completing their first teaching period, Participants are eligible to apply for up to two (2) years Leave of Absence from their award course without impacting their Scholarship entitlement. Participants who withdraw from their award course or up to the prior to the second s
	 Participants who withdraw from their award course or units prior to the completion of the teaching period (i.e., no grades are recorded) may be required to return monies paid to QUT.
	8. Special circumstances will be taken into consideration to support individual variation to the <i>Conditions of Scholarship</i> . Supporting documentary evidence may be requested. Participants are encouraged to discuss their special circumstances with the Scholarships team (<u>scholarships@qut.edu.au</u>), Faculty, or QUT Student Services.
	 Participants of the Scholarship cannot concurrently receive another merit, cooperative, or industry scholarship, but are eligible to receive a bursary, prize, or equity scholarship, whilst in receipt of the Scholarship.
	10. Unsuccessful applications:
	a. QUT's decision in the awarding of the Scholarship will be final
	b. QUT is not liable for any:
	 i. indirect or consequential loss; and ii. any loss of revenue, loss of profit, or loss of business opportunities, suffered by the Participant in connection with the Scholarship process whether under contract, tort (including negligence), or otherwise.
	11. The Participant accepts the Scholarship by doing the following:
