



QUT snapshot

- 53 254 total students (37 160 full-time equivalent) in 2021
- 7145 international students from 119 countries in 2021
- 13 249 staff (4459 full-time equivalent)
- QUT's Indigenous Australian students exceeded 1000 enrolments for the first time in 2021
- 1.9% of students and 1.9% of staff were Indigenous Australians in 2021
- 94% of 2020 graduates have undertaken at least one Real World Experience (international or Work Integrated Learning)
- In 2020 QUT's research income of \$109 million was higher than in previous years
- Campus to Country, QUT's award-winning Indigenous Australian campus development strategy, intends to connect campuses to place, both physically and through engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people
- Home to the Carumba Institute, an innovative leader in Indigenous research, education and community engagement, nationally and internationally
- The first Australian business school to earn 'triple crown' accreditation from the European Foundation for Management Development (EFMD), the Association of MBAs (AMBA) and the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB)
- 128 winners of Australian Awards for University Teaching (AAUT) since 2000
- 5th in Australia and 3rd in Queensland for Indigenous Australian award course completions in 2020
- In 2021 QUT's net carbon emissions were 20% less and waste to landfill was 40% less than in 2018
- Ranked equal 193rd in the world in 2022 THE World University Ranking. 111 – 120 in 2022 QS Employability Ranking including top 50 in employer-student connections
- 3rd ranked young university in Australia, and 21st in the world in the 2022 THE Young University Ranking
- 15th in Communication and Media Studies, equal 30th in Nursing and equal 45th in Engineering - Mineral & Mining in the world in the 2022 QS World University Rankings by Subject
- 1st in Australia for Biomedical Engineering and 13th in Nursing in the world in the Shanghai Ranking Global Ranking of Academic Subjects 2021
- 21 fields of research rated well above world standard in the Australian Research Council (ARC) Excellence in Research for Australia assessment 2018-2019, and a further 27 above world standard
- 12 case studies were ranked high for Engagement and 13 ranked high for Impact in the ARC Engagement and Impact assessment 2018–2019
