



QUT Snapshot

- The total number of students in 2023 was 52,070 (36,704 full-time equivalent). [9th highest nationally]
- QUT had a total of 42,254 domestic students in 2023. [4th highest nationally]
- QUT had a total of 9,816 international students from 128 countries in 2023. [17th highest nationally]
- QUT had a total of 12,010 staff (4,586 full-time equivalent) in 2023.
- In 2023 1.8% of students and 2.0% of staff were Indigenous Australians.
- 99% of 2023 graduates have undertaken at least one Real World Experience (international or work integrated learning).
- QUT has more than 298,000 alumni from QUT and predecessor institutions, living in more than 54 countries. Over 50,000 alumni have graduated with more than one QUT degree.
- In 2023 QUT's research income of \$125 million was higher than in previous years.
- *Campus to Country*, QUT's award-winning Indigenous Australian campus development strategy, intends to connect campuses to place, both physically and through engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.
- Home to the Carumba Institute, an innovative leader in Indigenous research, education and community engagement, nationally and internationally.
- The first Australian business school to earn 'triple crown' accreditation from the European Foundation for Management Development (EFMD), the Association of MBAs (AMBA) and the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB).
- QUT has had 136 winners of Australian Awards for University Teaching (AAUT) since 2000.
- Ranked 213th in the world in the 2025 QS World University Rankings.
- QUT was ranked 201-250 in the world in the THE World University Rankings 2025.
- QUT was named Entrepreneurial University of the Year for the Asia-Pacific region in the 2023 Triple E Awards.
- QUT was 6th in Australia and 2nd in Queensland for Indigenous Australian award course completions in 2023.
- In 2023 QUT's net carbon emissions and waste to landfill were both 32% less than in 2018.
- QUT was ranked 73rd in the world in the QS World University Rankings: Sustainability 2025.
- QUT was ranked 19th in Communication and Media Studies and equal 34th in Nursing in the 2024 QS World University Rankings by Subject.
- Ranked 1st in Biomedical Engineering in Australia and 24th in Nursing in the world in the ShanghaiRanking Global Ranking of Academic Subjects 2024.
