



QUT Rising Sport Scholarship

Terms and Conditions

Overview

The QUT Rising Sport Scholarship is a merit scholarship valued at \$5,000, offered to commencing and continuing domestic students. This is provided to the scholarship recipient directly in the form funds transfer to their nominated bank account.

These terms and conditions apply to students commencing in 2024. The scholarship requires an application and is offered from Semester 1, 2024.

Purpose

QUT is proud to support developing and elite athletes across a wide range of categories by offering sport scholarships annually for both new and existing QUT students. This includes talented sports and esports athletes who are still developing and progressing in their chosen sport through to high-performance level athletes representing Australia at national and international levels.

Our program is brought together by national high-performance coaches and support staff, digital well-being advocates, industry partners and researchers, providing unrivalled opportunities that are unique to the Australian sporting industry.

1 Eligibility requirements

To be eligible for the QUT Rising Sport Scholarship, applicants must meet all the following requirements:

- 1.1 Must be starting a university undergraduate degree for the first time OR be a continuing QUT student.
- 1.2 Must be an Australian citizen.
- 1.3 Must be either representing an Australian State or National Sporting Organisation (NSO) in a sport recognised by Sport Australia OR Professional Player League in an internationally recognised esports.
- 1.4 Must be either:
 - 1.4.1 A current 'Emerging' Athlete Categorisation with written verification from your NSO, State Institute/State Academy support network (SIS/SAS) or National Institute Network (NIN) to support your application; OR
 - 1.4.2 A minimum of Talent 4 (T4) athlete categorisation level within Sport Australia's FTEM framework; OR
 - 1.4.3 Written confirmation of representation at national or international level in an emerging or recognised sport that can be unfunded in the National Sporting Model.
- 1.5 Must have no anti-doping rule violations or match fixing offences at any time.
- 1.6 All QUT scholarships and bursaries are governed by concurrency conditions, detailed within the governing terms and conditions related to the applicable scholarship or bursary.

2 Application and selection criteria

- 2.1 The QUT Rising Sport Scholarship requires an application form. Due to the specific nature of the scholarship, you must provide:
 - 2.1.1 A sporting Curriculum Vitae (CV) providing an overview of sporting achievements undertaken at any point in time
 - 2.1.1.1 An overview of events should be listed in reverse chronological order (e.g., 2023, 2022, 2021, etc.)
 - 2.1.2 Any placing or ranking information (esports only)
 - 2.1.3 Two written references or contact information for two referees, from your Australian State Sporting Organisation or NSO who can verify your CV (if applicable)
 - 2.1.4 A copy of your team selection letters on the official letterhead
 - 2.1.5 Any webpage evidence of sporting achievements.
- 2.2 Esports applicants will be invited to attend and complete a trial at QUT Esports Arena, Gardens Point Campus, with the successful outcome of admittance to the QUT Esports Academy.

3 Value and payment of scholarship

- 3.1 Scholarships valued up to \$5,000 are paid at \$2,500 per year for a full-time enrolment load for a maximum of two years. Payments are made on a half-yearly basis (\$1,250 amount per semester/teaching period) and are disbursed the week after the census date of the enrolled semester/teaching period.
 - 3.1.1 Scholarship recipients who are awarded the QUT Rising Sport Scholarship with less than four semesters/teaching periods remaining in their award course will not receive the full amount of the scholarship.
- 3.2 Scholarship recipients who complete their study in accelerated mode (or before the terms of the scholarships lapse) the remaining balance of the scholarship funds will be forfeited and will not be paid to the scholarship recipient.
- 3.3 Scholarship recipients enrolled on a part-time (24 credit points or less) basis will receive 50% of the standard payment.
- 3.4 Payment will be subject to the Conditions below. If the scholarship recipient does not meet these Conditions payment may be suspended.
- 3.5 Scholarship recipients will receive scholarship payment by electronic transfer to their nominated bank account the week after census date each semester/teaching period.
- 3.6 Scholarship recipients enrolled in Exchange, Cross Institutional and BULA semester/teaching periods will have different census dates. Payments will be made one week after the census date of these semester/teaching periods.
- 3.7 While every care is taken to ensure direct payment of scholarship funds are correct, scholarship recipients are required to monitor payments and notify scholarships@qut.edu.au of any over or under payments.
 - 3.7.1 Where discrepancies in payment occur, scholarship recipients may be required to return the funds to the University.
- 3.8 **Tax implications**

QUT does not withhold PAYG tax from coursework scholarship payments. It is the recipient's responsibility to check the tax implications for your scholarship and personal circumstances. - 3.9 **Centrelink**

Please also note that Centrelink may include this scholarship entitlement in any means testing as a result of applications made for Commonwealth assistance. Please check the Centrelink site for information regarding exempt scholarships.

4 Term of scholarship

- 4.1 The term of the scholarship is determined by the scholarship recipient's enrolment load, either full-time or part-time (e.g., two years for the \$5,000 award, based on a full-time enrolment).
- 4.2 Scholarship recipients are permitted change to part-time enrolment if required. This may extend the terms of the scholarship.
- 4.3 Scholarship recipients must remain admitted and enrolled in a course to receive their scholarship payment as per Conditions.
 - 4.3.1 Scholarship recipients who complete their study in accelerated mode before the term of the scholarship ends the remaining balance of the scholarship funds will be forfeited and will **not** be paid to the scholarship recipient.

5 Conditions of scholarship

- 5.1 Scholarship recipients must achieve a minimum course (cumulative) Grade Point Average (GPA) of 4.50/7.00 in any given semester/teaching period to maintain the scholarship for the next semester/teaching period.
- 5.2 Special circumstances will be taken into consideration to support individual variation to the Conditions of scholarship. Supporting documentary evidence may be requested. Scholarship recipients are encouraged to discuss their special circumstance with {insert Faculty} or Counselling services.
- 5.3 **Progression**

- 5.3.1 Scholarship recipients whose course (cumulative) GPA drops below 4.50/7.00 are issued a notification that they are in breach of their scholarship condition but will continue to receive their payment for the currently enrolled semester/teaching period.
- 5.3.2 If their course (cumulative) GPA remains below 4.50/7.00 for the following semester/teaching period, payment may be suspended until further notice.
- 5.3.3 A third breach of the GPA condition may result in termination of the scholarship.
- 5.4 Scholarship recipients must remain admitted and enrolled in a course to receive their scholarship payment.
- 5.5 Scholarship recipients are permitted to change their course and continue to receive this scholarship unless otherwise specified in the scholarship offer letter.
- 5.6 Scholarship payments are suspended whilst a scholarship recipient is on an approved Leave of Absence. After completing their first semester/teaching period, scholarship recipients can apply for up to two years Leave of Absence from their course without impacting their scholarship.
- 5.7 Scholarship recipients who withdraw from their studies prior to completion of the semester/teaching period (i.e., no grades are recorded) may be required to return monies paid for the withdrawn units.
- 5.8 Scholarship recipients must remain actively engaged in their sport or esport to receive their scholarship payments.
- 5.9 Scholarship recipients must represent QUT Sport where key opportunities exist, up to a maximum of two engagements per year. QUT Sport will provide numerous opportunities for engagements for scholarship recipients.
 - 5.9.1 This may include, but is not limited to, speaking at QUT Sport events, contesting the National University Championships (if your sport is contested), and participating in other campus events.
- 5.10 Deferment of the scholarship *offer* is not available to any scholarship recipient.
- 5.11 Scholarship recipients on the QUT Rising Sport Scholarship cannot concurrently receive another merit, cooperative, or industry scholarship, but are eligible to receive a bursary, prize, or equity scholarship, while being a merit scholarship recipient.

6 Termination of scholarship

The University reserves the right to cease a scholarship in the following circumstances:

- 6.1 Failure to comply with the Conditions of the scholarship.
- 6.2 Withdrawal from your course. Scholarship recipients are advised to contact scholarships@qut.edu.au or Counselling services before withdrawing from their course.
- 6.3 Failure to enrol into a course following the completion of the approved Leave of Absence period.
- 6.4 Student behaviour that breaches the QUT Student Code of Conduct, where if proven would be regarded as student misconduct. The required standards of behaviour relate to policies regarding [Academic integrity \(MOPP C/5.3\)](#), [QUT Code for responsible conduct of research \(MOPP D/2.6\)](#), [Acceptable use of information technology resources \(MOPP F/1.11\)](#).

7 Grievances

- 7.1 Scholarship recipients should initially contact the QUT Scholarships office to discuss their grievance to see if this can be resolved prior to lodging a formal appeal.
- 7.2 Scholarship recipient may lodge a formal appeal arising from any scholarship matter through the [Appeals Committee](#).
- 7.3 Any grievances related to the administration of scholarships is governed by [E/9.2 Grievance resolution procedures for student related grievances, with QUT's Manual of Policy and Procedures](#).
