### General:

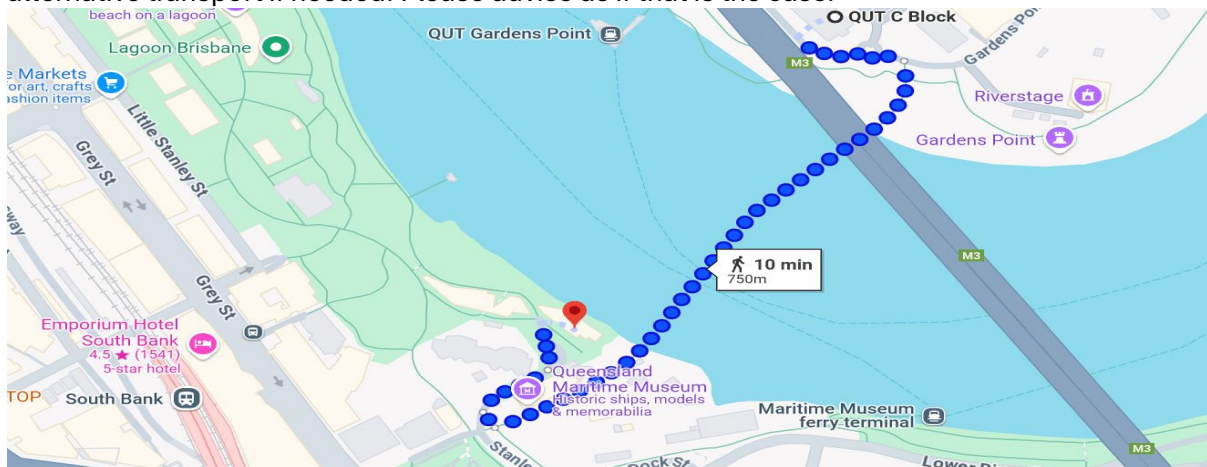
