

Indigenous Commonwealth Scholarship

Terms and conditions

Overview

The Indigenous Commonwealth Scholarship ('*the Scholarship*'), which includes the Indigenous Commonwealth Education Costs Scholarship valued at up to AU\$4,200.00, and the Indigenous Commonwealth Accommodation Scholarship valued at up to AU\$5,000.00, is offered to Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Persons enrolled at or applying to QUT.

These terms and conditions apply to Participants receiving a Scholarship in 2025.

Purpose

The Indigenous Commonwealth Scholarships are generously funded by the Australian Government's Indigenous Student Success Program (ISSP), which provides grants to higher education providers to assist Indigenous Australian students undertake higher education.

Indigenous Commonwealth Scholarships aim to increase the number of Indigenous Australian persons enrolling in courses leading to higher education awards and increase the number of Indigenous Australian students progressing in and completing courses leading to higher education awards.

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Part 1 1 Eligibility Requirements	 To be eligible for the Indigenous Commonwealth Education Costs Scholarship, Participants must satisfy the below eligibility requirements: a. must be an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Person as defined under Section 5 of the <u>Confirmation of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Descent Policy</u> and have had a processing officer from the Oodgeroo Unit or Carumba Institute confirm Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Descent via the <u>Confirmation of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Descent via the Confirmation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Descent (CATSID) procedure; and</u> b. must be enrolled in or applying for a research or coursework award course at QUT in 2025; and c. must be able to demonstrate financial disadvantage by either: i. being in receipt of a means-tested Commonwealth income support payment; or ii. a comprehensive assessment by the University (e.g., an Equity Scholarships Scheme assessment, or an Equity Emergency or Work Integrated Learning (WIL) Bursary assessment through Student Support and Wellbeing); and

	 Participants are only eligible to receive one (1) Indigenous Commonwealth Accommodation Scholarship at any point during the lifetime of their studies at QUT.
	 Scholarship availabilities will be subject to annual Indigenous Student Success Program (ISSP) funding from the Commonwealth.
	5. For the purposes of these term and conditions, <i>teaching period</i> means the Semester 1 and/or 2 teaching periods. Payments will not be made to Participants in a teaching period not designated as a Semester 1 and/or 2 teaching period, including Summer Program, or any other teaching period designated in the Grouped Period 1 (Semester 1 Cluster), Grouped Period 2 (Semester 2 Cluster), or Grouped Period 3 (Summer Cluster), unless otherwise specified in the Scholarship offer letter.
	6. Participants who complete their studies in accelerated mode or before the term of the Scholarship lapses will forfeit any remaining balance of the Scholarship.
	7. Payment is subject to the <i>Conditions of Scholarship</i> . If the Participant fails to adhere to the <i>Conditions of Scholarship</i> , payment may be suspended or terminated, unless special circumstances apply (see <i>Indigenous Student Assistance Grants Guidelines 2017</i> (Cth) s 27(3)).
	8. Participants will receive payment by electronic transfer to their nominated bank account after the census date of each teaching period.
	 Whilst every care is taken to ensure payment is correct, Participants are required to monitor payments and notify the Scholarships team (scholarships@qut.edu.au) of any over or under payments.
	10. Overpayments:
	 a. if an overpayment occurs at any time and for any reason, QUT may issue the Participant with a written notice requiring repayment of the amount overpaid ('Overpayment Notice'); and b. the Participant must pay to QUT the amount of the overpayment
	specified in the Overpayment Notice within ten (10) business days of the date of the Overpayment Notice; and
	c. QUT may, at its sole discretion, recover the overpayment specified in the Overpayment Notice from the Participant by offsetting that overpayment against any amount subsequently due to the Participant as part of their Scholarship.
	 11. Taxation: QUT does not withhold PAYG tax from coursework scholarship, bursary, or prize payments. It is the Participant's responsibility to check the tax implications for their scholarship, bursary, or prize and personal circumstances. Participants are encouraged to use the <u>Australian Taxation Office's scholarship decision tool</u>. For more information, visit www.ato.gov.au/individuals.
	12. Centrelink: Centrelink may include this Scholarship entitlement in any means testing

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	for applications made for Commonwealth assistance. Participants are encouraged to check the Centrelink website for information regarding exemptions.
Part 4 Term of Scholarship	1. The term of the Scholarship will be for one (1) year for Participants who apply in the Semester 1 teaching period.
	2. The term of the Scholarship will be for the Semester 2 teaching period only for Participants who apply in the Semester 2 teaching period.
Part 5 Conditions of	1. The Scholarship is governed by the grant conditions as prescribed under the <i>Higher Education Support Act 2003</i> (Cth) and the <i>Indigenous</i> <i>Student Assistance Grants Guidelines 2017</i> (Cth).
Scholarship	2. Participants must remain enrolled in an award course at QUT.
	3. Participants who accept an offer for the Scholarship may:
	a. be required to inform any of the following persons of the receipt of the Scholarship, depending on their personal circumstances:
	i. an employee of the Human Services Department; and
	ii. an employee of the Department administered by the Minister administering the Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986 (Cth); and
	iii. an employee of the Department administered by the Minister administering section 258 of the <i>Military</i> <i>Rehabilitation and Compensation Act 2004</i> (Cth); and
	b. not qualify for certain other forms of Commonwealth assistance.
	4. Participants must use the Scholarship for its intended purpose, that being to fund education costs if in receipt of the Indigenous Commonwealth Education Costs Scholarship, or fund relocation costs and/or accommodation costs if in receipt of the Indigenous Commonwealth Accommodation Scholarship.
	5. Without limiting Part 5 Clause 12, Participants are permitted to receive the Scholarship if already in receipt of assistance. However, Participants are not permitted to receive the Scholarship if the awarding of the Scholarship would result in the Participant receiving assistance concurrently from two or more Commonwealth sources for the same purpose. This includes assistance intended for the same or similar purpose under the Social Security Act 1991 (Cth), the ABSTUDY Scheme and the Student Assistance Act 1973 (Cth), the Veterans' Children Education Scheme, or the Military Rehabilitation and Compensation Act Education and Training Scheme Instrument 2004 (Cth).
	6. Participants must not transfer their award course from QUT to a different higher education provider.
	7. Participants in receipt of the Indigenous Commonwealth Accommodation Scholarship must not defer their award course.
	8. Participants are permitted to change their award course and continue to receive the Scholarship, unless otherwise specified in the Scholarship offer letter.
	9. Deferment of the Scholarship offer is not permitted.
	10. Participants who withdraw from their award course or units prior to the completion of the teaching period (i.e., no grades are recorded) may be

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	required to return monies paid to QUT.
	11. Special circumstances will be taken into consideration to support individual variation to the <i>Conditions of Scholarship</i> . Supporting documentary evidence may be requested. Participants are encouraged to discuss their special circumstances with the Scholarships team (scholarships@qut.edu.au) or QUT Student Services.
	12. Participants of the Scholarship are eligible to receive another QUT scholarship, bursary or prize, whilst in receipt of the Scholarship.
	13. Without limiting Part 5 Clause 12, Participants of the Scholarship cannot concurrently receive a scholarship or bursary offered via the Equity Scholarships Scheme whilst in receipt of the Scholarship. In the event the Participant receives both an offer for a scholarship or bursary offered via the Equity Scholarships Scheme and an offer for the Scholarship during the active term of the Scholarship, the Participant shall be required to accept one (1) offer only and forfeit the other offer.
	14. If payment has already been disbursed to the Participant for the forfeited scholarship or bursary, and the value of the accepted scholarship or bursary is:
	 higher than the value of the forfeited scholarship or bursary, the Participant shall be entitled to receive a top-up amount equal to the difference between the accepted scholarship or bursary and the forfeited scholarship or bursary; or
	 b. lower than the value of the forfeited scholarship or bursary, the Participant shall be issued with an Overpayment Notice and be required pay to QUT the difference between the accepted scholarship or bursary and the forfeited scholarship or bursary in line with the overpayment policy prescribed under Part 3 Clause 9 and Part 3 Clause 10.
	15. Unsuccessful applications:
	 QUT's decision in the awarding of the Scholarship will be final; and
	b. QUT is not liable for any:
	i. indirect or consequential loss; and
	 any loss of revenue, loss of profit, or loss of business opportunities, suffered by the Participant in connection with the Scholarship process whether under contract, tort (including negligence), or otherwise.
	16. The Participant accepts the Scholarship by doing the following:
	 accept the Scholarship and agree to the declaration and terms and conditions in the online offer acceptance form by the date specified; and
	b. provide QUT with student bank details.
	17. If the Participant does not accept the Scholarship by the date specified in the offer letter, the Participant will forfeit the Scholarship and QUT reserves the right to allocate the Scholarship to another person.
Part 6 Under 18	 If the Participant is under the age of 18 years, the Participant will be deemed to have obtained the permission of the Participant's parent or legal guardian to participate in the Scholarship application process and the Scholarship award and to be bound by these terms and conditions.

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Part 7	Where an application is required:
General Requirements for Application Terms	1. All applications become the property of QUT upon submission, upload or otherwise.
	2. Applications must be received by QUT during the application period.
	3. A student claiming to be a Participant must provide proof of identity, if required by QUT.
	4. Each Participant may be required to sign a document indicating that they have received their Scholarship payment at the time of payment.
	5. Any decision of QUT, the Scholarship sponsor or donor, in respect of all matters arising out of, or in connection with, the Scholarship is final and binding and no correspondence will be entered into. See <i>Grievances and Appeals</i> below for information on appeals.
	6. Each Participant is responsible for notifying QUT of any change to contact details during the application process and after the Scholarship has been awarded.
	7. If the Scholarship process is interfered with in any way or is not capable of being conducted as anticipated due to any reason beyond reasonable control of QUT, QUT reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to modify, suspend, terminate, or cancel the Scholarship, as appropriate.
	8. This Scholarship and these terms and conditions are governed by the laws of Queensland.
Part 8 Termination of	QUT reserves the right to cease the Scholarship awarded to a Participant in the following circumstances:
Scholarship	1. Failure to comply with the Conditions of Scholarship.
	2. Failure to comply with the grant conditions as prescribed under the <i>Higher Education Support Act 2003</i> (Cth) and the <i>Indigenous Student</i> <i>Assistance Grants Guidelines 2017</i> (Cth).
	3. Withdrawal from award course. Participants are advised to contact the Scholarships team (scholarships@qut.edu.au) or QUT Student Services before withdrawing from their award course.
	4. Engaging in behaviour that breaches the QUT Student Code of Conduct, where if proven would be regarded as student misconduct. The required standards of behaviour are contained within the <u>Academic Integrity</u> <u>Policy</u> , the <u>QUT Code for Responsible Conduct of Research</u> , and the <u>Acceptable Use of Information and Communications Technology</u> <u>Resources Policy</u> .
Part 9	Where the Participant intends to lodge an application for a grievance:
Grievances and Appeals	 Participants should initially contact the Scholarships team (scholarships@qut.edu.au) or Student Ombudsman to undertake informal resolution of grievance prior to requesting formal resolution of grievance (Level One – Informal Resolution of Grievance). Most grievances are resolved informally, through discussion with the involved parties.
	 Where the Participant is dissatisfied with the outcome, they may apply to the Student Ombudsman for Level Two – Formal Resolution of Grievance, or the Student Ombudsman may determine that it is appropriate to progress the matter to Level Two. Where the grievance is not resolved at Level Two, the Participant may request that the Vice-President (Administration) and University Registrar

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	progress the grievance to Level Three – Formal Grievance Determination. The request must be made within 10 working days of notification of the outcome at Level Two.
	4. Any grievances related to the administration of scholarships, bursaries, and prizes are governed by the <u>Grievance Resolution Procedures for</u> <u>Student Related Grievances</u> .
	Where the Participant intends to appeal a matter:
	 Participants should initially contact the Scholarships team (scholarships@qut.edu.au) to appeal a scholarship matter.
	2. Where the Participant is dissatisfied with the outcome, they may apply to the Scholarships team (<u>scholarships@qut.edu.au</u>) to appeal a scholarship matter to the Appeals Committee.
	3. Any appeals related to scholarship, bursary, and prize matters are governed by these terms and conditions, the <u>University Committee</u> <u>Governance Policy</u> , and the <u>Appeals Committee Charter</u> .
Part 10 Privacy	1. By applying for the Scholarship, the Participant provides permission for their personal details to be shared with the Selection Panel. QUT collects the personal information on the Scholarship application form to assess applications and for other university purposes upon enrolment. The collection is authorised under the QUT Student Rules. 	3. QUT will collect and use the Participant's personal information for the purposes of administering and carrying out the Scholarship and may share information with nominated third parties who require the information for the management of the Scholarship. This information will not be used for promotion and marketing purposes.
Part 11	Without limiting any part of the Scholarship terms and conditions, QUT may:
Reserving the Right to Amend	1. Amend or replace these terms and conditions, or any Scholarship rules or procedures, at any time and for any reason.
	2. Extend, suspend, or terminate the Scholarship or Scholarship process at any time before the Scholarship is awarded.
	3. Accept applications after the due date.
	4. At any time prior to awarding the Scholarship, disqualify any Participant from participating or exclude their offer from further consideration.
	Commence a new process for calling applications on a similar or different basis to that outlined in these terms and conditions.
	6. Use non-QUT personnel in assessing applications.
