- 2) Short-term Mobility Programs

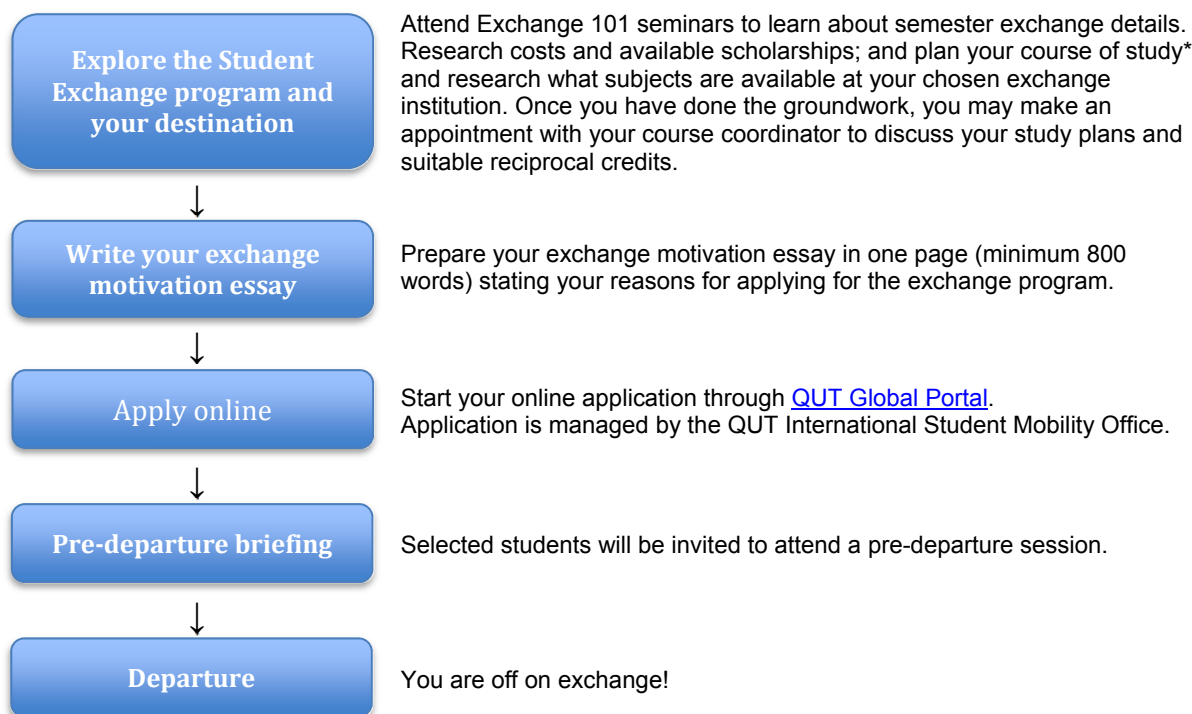
1. Semester Exchange

Semester exchange gives you an opportunity to study at QUT's partner universities for one or two semesters. You gain credit points towards your degree by doing approved relevant overseas units semester exchange at the host university while being enrolled at QUT.

2. Short-term Mobility Programs

Short-term mobility programs are run by the Faculty of Health and its schools usually over the semester breaks (Jun-Jul and Nov-Jan) and are generally between 2 and 4 weeks in length held at various overseas partner universities. You may gain credit towards your degree and explore a new culture at the same time.

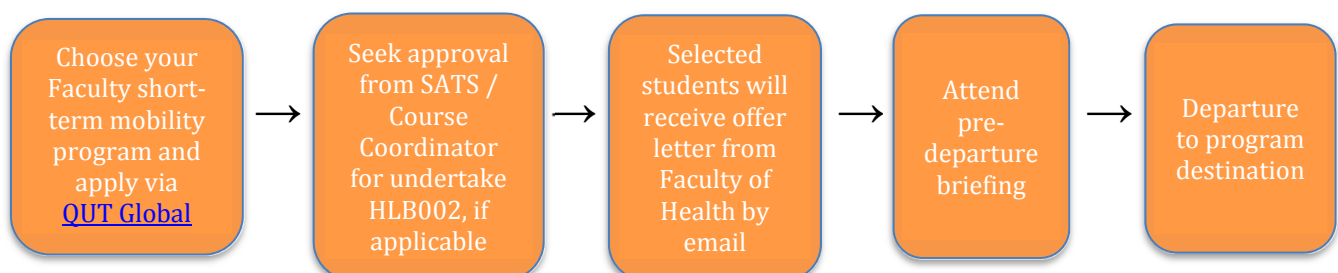
Previous program destinations of Faculty programs include China, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan and Vietnam.
