
Start your weekend visiting the Kelvin Grove weekly markets or visit an art exhibition or live performance at the Creative Industries Precinct.



English language requirements

You must meet the minimum English language For this time the minimum English, an Literature, or English and Literature, or English as an Additional Language (Units 3 & 4, C). The equivalent Australian Interstate senior English subjects or International Baccalaureate Diploma studies or the required grade in an accepted English language test may also meet the minimum English language requirement.

Assumed knowledge

For most courses, QUT has an assumed knowledge scheme. This means that we don't use specific school subjects as entry criteria, however, we assume you have this knowledge when you study with us. Visit qut.edu.au/assumed-knowledge

Entry requirements for double degrees

A double degree combines two bachelor's degrees A double degree combines two bachelor's degrees into a single course of study. You can complete a double degree in a shorter time than two separate degrees, saving you time and money. Apply via QTAC, listing the double degree as one of your course preferences, the same as you would for any single degree. - You must have passed four semesters at Australian high school level or equivalent in Mathematical Methods or Specialist Mathematics and at least one of Agricultural Science, Biology, Chemistry, Earth and Environmental Science, Marine Science or Durging (Unit 2, 8, 4, P) ** Science or Physics (Units 3 & 4, B).


