CHECKLIST 2 Career and study exploration

We understand that having to choose a career path that makes the most of your skills and helps you realise your goals right now might feel a little daunting.

Embarking on the journey towards your future career—and considering whether you need to go to university to achieve it—is a big decision. It doesn't have to be an overwhelming one though.

This checklist will help you explore your interests and consider your future university education opportunities.

Who can use this checklist?

- students considering post-school study and career options
- parent/carers having career conversations with their student
- teachers and guidance officers fostering career conversations in the classroom
- preparation before attending activities such as open days or events and when asking questions of university staff.

This checklist has been designed as a means of providing you, as a future learner—or as the parent/guardian of a future student—with some key, thought-provoking questions to assist you with:

- exploration of your career interests
- furthering your education and possibly studying at university.
