Money Matters

OPENING AN ACCOUNT

When opening a bank account you will need to present your passport, proof of enrolment as a student and your Tax File Number.

While every bank has an account suitable for your day-today needs, we recommend that you ask about:

- Student banking and transaction fees,
- Overseas transfer charges, and
- ATM locations at your QUT campus.

The Keycard Account allows you to deposit, withdraw cash & transfer money from an Automatic Teller Machine (ATM) or use EFTPOS (Electronic Funds Transfer at Point of Sale).

At major supermarkets and department stores, you can withdraw cash with or without a store purchase free of charge.

TAX FILE NUMBER (TFN)

If you are opening a bank account or wish to commence employment, you will need a Tax File Number (TFN) from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

You will need to supply information relating to your name, current address, date of birth and date of arrival in Australia.

PAYING BILLS

BPAY is the universal method of paying bills. When you see the distinctive BPAY logo and Biller Code on your bill, log on to your online, mobile or phone bank account.

Bills can also be paid at your local Post Office. To find your nearest location, visit www.auspost.com.au
Remember to keep a record of your receipts to protect your financial security.

EMPLOYMENT

Under current Student Visa regulations, international students are allowed to work up to 40 hours per fortnight during the study semester. During semester breaks, there is no limit to the number of hours you can work.

If there is a formal requirement to acquire work experience to obtain your degree, you may exceed the 40 hours limit. This limit only applies to paid work.

While most student visas come with 'permission to work,' if yours has the 'no work' condition then you will have to apply for a separate visa.

STUDENT VISA

As an international student, you must maintain a valid student visa while studying at QUT. If you have any issues with your Visa, please book an appointment with an ISS counsellor.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

If you're having money probelms, you can talk with an International Student Services for financial assistance.

You may be eligible for some financial assistance such as:

- Students Financial Assistance Scheme (SFAS) which provides loans to help students in financial need.
- Equity bursaries
- QUT Guild foodbank
- External community organisations such as Salvos or St Vinnies.

To qualify for the SFAS loan or Equity bursaries, you must:

- Be currently enrolled as a QUT student
- Require financial assistance for basic living
- Have tried all other ways to obtain finance (i.e. family, friends, banks, etc)

PROOF OF AGE

Entry into nightclubs/pubs/bars/licensed venues requires a proof of age of over 18. In Australia, the student ID cards and home driver's licenses are not accepted and carrying your passport is not advised.

You will need to obtain an Adult Proof of Age card by presenting 3 forms of identification to the Queensland Transport Customer Service Centre.

The cost is approximately \$66.65
