

Argent Indigenous Nursing Scholarship

Terms and Conditions

Overview

The Argent Indigenous Nursing Scholarship is awarded to empower and provide financial assistance to Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Bachelor of Nursing students, in their second or third year of full-time study.

1. Eligibility requirements

To be eligible for The Argent Indigenous Nursing Scholarship, applicants must meet all the following requirements;

- 1.1. identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
- 1.2. be commencing or continuing your second or third year of a Bachelor of Nursing (NS42)
- 1.3. studying full-time (minimum 36 credit points per semester) in the year the scholarship is awarded
- 1.4. a minimum GPA of 4.00

2. Value and payment of scholarships

- 2.1 The Argent Indigenous Nursing Scholarship is awarded to the value of \$10,000.
- 2.2 A student may receive one (1) Argent Indigenous Nursing Scholarship in the duration of their eligible course.
- 2.3 Payments will be subject to Section 4 Conditions of the scholarship being met.
- 2.4 Students will receive scholarship payment by electronic transfer to their nominated bank account at the commencement of their grant-supported placement.
- 2.5 While every care is taken to ensure direct payments of scholarship funds are correct, scholarship recipients are required to monitor payments and notify QUT Scholarships by emailing scholarships@qut.edu.au if any over or under payments occur. Where discrepancies in payment occur, students may be required to return the funds to the university.

3. Term of scholarship

3.1. The term of the scholarship is four, equal payments, paid after the census date and during the exam period of Semester's 1 and 2 in the year the scholarship is awarded.

4. Conditions of scholarship

- 4.1. Students receiving The Argent Indigenous Nursing Scholarship must maintain;
 - 4.1.1. A grade point average of at least 4.00
 - 4.1.2. an enrolment of at least 36 credit points for both Semester 1 and 2 in the year their scholarship is awarded.

5. Termination of scholarship

A scholarship may be terminated in the following circumstances,

- 5.1. Failure to comply with Section 4 Conditions of scholarship
- 5.2. Withdrawal or deferment from the eligible course. Students are advised to access Counselling services before withdrawing from their course.
- 5.3. Student behaviour that breaches the QUT Student Code of Conduct, where if proven would be regarded as student misconduct. The required standards of behaviour relate to policies regarding <u>Academic integrity (MOPP C/5.3)</u>, <u>QUT Code for responsible conduct of research (MOPP D/2.6)</u>, Acceptable use of information technology resources (MOPP F/1.11)

6. Miscellaneous

6.1. Grievances

- 6.1.1 Student may lodge a formal appeal arising from any scholarship matter through the Appeals Committee
- 6.1.2 Any grievances related to the administration of scholarship is governed by <u>E/9.2</u> <u>Grievance resolution procedures for student related grievances</u>, with QUT's Manual of Policy and Procedures.

6.2. Tax implications

6.2.1 QUT does not withhold PAYG tax from coursework scholarship payments. It is the recipient's responsibility to check the tax implications for your scholarship and personal circumstances.
