# Year 12 subject scheme

The QUT Year 12 subject scheme offers selection rank adjustments making you more competitive in meeting course requirements.

You must successfully complete the specified subjects with Sound Achievements over 4 semesters in Year 11 and 12 (4 SA or better). You can receive a maximum of 8 selection rank adjustments.

This scheme applies to students completing Year 12 or equivalent in 2018 and applying for entry in 2019. Visit [www.qut.edu.au/entry-bonus](http://www.qut.edu.au/entry-bonus)

## Apply to QUT

### 1) Choose a course

### 2) Submit Application

Submit your application through the Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre (QTAC) [www.qtac.edu.au](http://www.qtac.edu.au) from August. If you wish to nominate an agent, submit an Agent Appointment form to QUT after lodging your QTAC application: [www.qut.edu.au/international/applying/year-12](http://www.qut.edu.au/international/applying/year-12)

### 3) Receive a Conditional Offer

QUT will issue you a conditional Letter of Offer for your highest nominated QUT course from late August. Offers will be conditional on course academic and

English language requirements. Some courses have additional requirements.

Should you require an offer for a different course, please email [qut.intadmission@qut.edu.au](mailto:qut.intadmission@qut.edu.au). QUT will not issue you another offer if you change your preference in QTAC.

### 4) Release of Year 12 Results and Change of Preference

When your final Year 12 results are released, check that you have met all the requirements for your preferred course. Selection rank adjustments will be applied at this point (refer to Year 12 subject scheme above).

## CHLOE CHAU, HONG KONG

Business student (2nd year)

Completed Year 12 at The Gap State High School
