



## NOJA Power Future Scholarship 2023 Terms and Conditions

Closing date for applications is **9 March 2023**. Late applications will not be accepted under any circumstances.

### ELIGIBILITY

- To be eligible for a NOJA Power Future Scholarship applicants must meet the following criteria:
  - Be an Australian citizen or permanent resident.
  - Have a GPA of 6 or greater.
  - Be a current undergraduate domestic student who in 2023 will be enrolling in the final year of one of the Engineering Degree majoring in:
    - Computer and Software Systems
    - Electrical Engineering

Students enrolled in one of the following double degrees are also eligible if in 2023 they will be entering the equivalent of their final year of an Engineering course majoring in: Computer and Software Systems, and Electrical Engineering

- IX59 Bachelor of Business/Bachelor of Engineering (Honours)
- SE40 Bachelor of Engineering (Honours)/Bachelor of Mathematics
- SE60 Bachelor of Engineering (Honours)/Bachelor of Information Technology
- SE80 Bachelor of Engineering (Honours)/Bachelor of Science.

### SCHOLARSHIP ASSESSMENT

- Scholarship assessment is based on a combination of academic achievement, interview, and demonstrated interest and aspirations in electrical engineering or computer and software systems as a chosen profession.
- A shortlist of up to 7 applicants will undergo an interview by a panel of NOJA Power representatives.

### SCHOLARSHIP OFFERS

- An offer will be made to the top applicant identified. A conditional scholarship offer will be made once the process has been completed.
- The successful scholarship recipient will be required to attend a small awards ceremony with the scholarship donor, NOJA Power, provide a letter of thanks to the scholarship donor, and participate in an online news story about the scholarship.
- These scholarships cannot be deferred.

### RETAINING THE SCHOLARSHIP

- Scholarship recipients must be enrolled full-time (minimum 36 credit points per semester) in one of the EN01 majors listed above for the duration of their studies to retain this scholarship.
- Scholarship recipients must be enrolled in EGH400-1 and EGH400-2 for the upcoming semesters.
- Scholarship recipients must pass all units and achieve a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 6 in each semester in each scholarship year in order to maintain the scholarship. Failure to maintain this condition may result in the scholarship being terminated.



## NOJA Power Future Scholarship 2023 Terms and Conditions

### SCHOLARSHIP PAYMENT

10. The scholarship is valued at up to \$15,000 and will be paid two payments of \$7,500 per semester.
11. All scholarship payments will be made after HECS census date in semester 1, 2023 and semester 2, 2023.
12. While every care is taken to ensure direct payments of scholarship funds are correct, scholarships recipients are required to monitor payments and notify QUT if any over or under payments occur. If under payments occur, the balance will be paid to the student immediately. If over-payments occur the scholarship recipient is required to advise QUT immediately and repay the overpaid amount.
13. Although QUT does not take any tax off the award amount, QUT is not authorised to deem this scholarship tax exempt. Ultimate determination regarding the tax status of the Scholarship will be made by the Australian Taxation Office. Please retain this statement with your tax documentation. 14. In the event of special, extenuating circumstances while in the receipt of this scholarship, scholars must contact the Faculty of Engineering to discuss their situation.
15. For all intents and purposes, the NOJA Power Future Scholarship is classed as an industry scholarship.
16. This scholarship is bound by the Scholarship Concurrency Policy. The QUT Scholarships Concurrency Policy governs whether certain scholarship combinations can be held by a student concurrently. The table below provides information on what scholarships can be held concurrently at QUT.
