



ALLEN AND UNWIN PRIZE TERMS AND CONDITIONS

GENERAL

1. Closing date for applications is Monday 30 September 2020 at 5pm. Late applications will **not** be accepted.
2. To be eligible for the Allen and Unwin Prize applicants must meet the following criteria:

You must be enrolled in an undergraduate Creative Writing degree	You must be enrolled full time	You must also be one of: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• an Australian or New Zealand citizen• a permanent resident• the holder of a permanent humanitarian visa• an international student who has completed high school in Australia.

3. Applications are only open to domestic and international students who have completed their secondary studies in Australia.

A. ENROLMENT

5. Recipients must remain enrolled as a full-time student at QUT for the duration of the studies to retain their prize.
6. After first semester, students are able to take approved Leave of Absence for up to 12 months (in accordance with QUT Student Rules) and still retain the scholarship. Prize payments will not be made to the scholar while on an approved Leave of Absence.

B. RECIPIENT PERFORMANCE OBLIGATIONS

7. All Allen and Unwin Prize recipients must maintain full time enrolment in a Creative Writing undergraduate degree. Failure to maintain this condition may result in the scholarship being terminated.

C. SCHOLARSHIP VALUE AND DISBURSEMENT

8. The one year prize valued at \$500 will be paid as a study stipend of \$200 and up to two hours editorial assistance.
9. While every care is taken to ensure direct payments of prize funds are correct, recipients are required to monitor payments and notify QUT if any over or under payments occur. If under payments occur, the balance will be paid to the student immediately. If over payments occur the recipient is required to advise QUT immediately and repay the overpaid amount.

D. GRIEVANCES

10. Any grievances arising from the administration of this prize is governed by **E/9.2 Grievance resolution procedures for student related grievances** found in QUT's Manual of Policy and Procedures - http://www.mopp.qut.edu.au/E/E_09_02.jsp
11. All prize delivery is governed by the QUT Manual of Policy and Procedures, *Chapter E - 11 Prizes, Awards and Scholarships*

E. CONCURRENCY

12. For all intents and purposes the Allen and Unwin Prize is classed as an Industry prize.
13. The Allen and Unwin Prize is bound by the Scholarship Concurrency Policy. The QUT Scholarships Concurrency Policy determines whether certain scholarship combinations can be held by a student concurrently. Refer to the concurrency table provided below.

To determine if a combination of scholarships can be held concurrently by a student, determine scholarship type A on the Y axis and Scholarship Type B on the X axis and slide down and across simultaneously until you reach the concurrency decision for that scholarship combination.
