

QUT David Klingberg Memorial Scholarship

Terms and Conditions

Overview

The David Klingberg Memorial is an industry scholarship valued at \$30,000, offered to continuing domestic students. This is provided to the Participant directly in the form of funds transfer.

These terms and conditions apply to Participants commencing the Scholarship in 2025. The Scholarship requires an application and is offered from Semester 1, 2025.

Purpose

The purpose of the David Klingberg Scholarship is to foster the education of future leaders of industries related to civil engineering while honouring a humble and innovative leader of the profession.

1. Eligibility Requirements	<p>To be eligible for the David Klingberg Memorial Scholarship, Participants must meet all of these requirements:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Must fall into one of the categories below: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. An Australian or New Zealand citizen; OR b. A permanent resident of Australia; OR c. A holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa. 2. Must have a GPA of 5.5 or above. 3. Must be in the second year of full-time enrolment in one of these courses in Semester 1, 2025: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. EN01 Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Civil). b. EN40 Bachelor of Engineering (Civil). c. EV11 Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) / Master of Sustainable Infrastructure 4. Participants enrolled in one of the following double degrees are also eligible if in Semester 1, 2025 they will be entering the equivalent of their second year of an Engineering course majoring in Civil Engineering: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. SE40 Bachelor of Mathematics / Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Civil) b. SE60 Bachelor of Information Technology / Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Civil) c. SE80 Bachelor of Science / Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Civil) d. IX59 Bachelor of Business / Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Civil)

All QUT scholarships and bursaries are governed by concurrency conditions, detailed within the governing terms and conditions related to the applicable scholarship or bursary.</p>
2. Application and selection criteria	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The David Klingberg Memorial Scholarship requires an application form. Due to the specific nature of the Scholarship, Participants must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Complete the online application. b. Provide a copy of up-to-date curriculum vitae or resume. c. A copy of academic record from HiQ site. 2. Applications must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Be submitted by the closing date. b. Include any and all supporting documentation in the correct form. c. Written in the English language. 3. Scholarship assessment is based on a combination of academic achievement, responses to the selection criteria and, if shortlisted for interview, responses to the interview questions. 4. A shortlist of up to five Participants will undergo an interview by a panel comprised of a minimum of two people including a representative from the Science and Engineering Faculty and a representative of Wagstaff Piling Pty Ltd. 5. The Participants will be required to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. meet with representatives of Wagstaff Piling Pty Ltd, and potentially the family of David Klingberg, b. provide a letter of thanks to Wagstaff Piling Pty Ltd, and potentially the family of David Klingberg, and c. participate in an online news story about the Scholarship. 6. QUT has discretion with any decisions made, in connection with this scholarship process. To the extent permitted by law QUT has no liability to any student for decisions made in relation to the Scholarship.
3. Value and payment of scholarship	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Scholarships valued up to \$30,000 are paid at \$10,000 per year for a full-time enrolment load for a maximum of three (3) year. Payments are made on a half-yearly basis of \$5,000 per semester and are disbursed the week after the census date of the enrolled semester/teaching period. 2. For Participants who complete their study in accelerated mode (or before the terms of the Scholarships lapse), the remaining balance of the Scholarship funds will be forfeited and will not be paid to the student. 3. Payment will be subject to the Conditions below. If Participants do not meet these Conditions payment may be suspended. 4. The Participants will receive scholarship payment by electronic transfer to their nominated bank account after census date each semester/teaching period. 5. The Participants enrolled in exchange, cross institutional and BULA

	<p>semesters/semester/teaching periods will have different census dates. Payments will be made one week after the census date of these semester/teaching periods.</p> <p>6. While every care is taken to ensure direct payment of scholarship funds are correct, the Participants are required to monitor payments and notify QUT Scholarships scholarships@qut.edu.au of any over or under payments.</p> <p>7. Overpayments:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> If an overpayment occurs at any time and for any reason QUT may issue the Participant with a written notice requiring repayment of the amount overpaid (“Overpayment Notice”). The Participant must pay to QUT the amount of the overpayment specified in the overpayment notice within ten (10) business days of the date of the notice. QUT may, at its sole discretion, recover the overpayment specified in the overpayment notice from the student by offsetting that overpayment against any amount subsequently due to the student as part of their scholarship. <p>8. Tax implications: QUT does not withhold PAYG tax from coursework scholarships payments. It is the Participant’s responsibility to check the tax implications for your scholarship and personal circumstances. For advice on whether your scholarship is taxable, use the Australian Taxation Office's scholarship decision tool. Additional tax information can be obtained via www.ato.gov.au/individuals.</p> <p>9. Centrelink: Please also note that Centrelink may include this scholarship entitlement in any means testing as a result of applications made for Commonwealth assistance. Please check the Centrelink site for information regarding exempt scholarships.</p>
4. Term of scholarship	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> The term of the Scholarship is determined by the student’s full-time enrolment load (e.g., three (3) years for the \$30,000 award, based on a full-time enrolment). Participants must remain admitted and enrolled full-time in one of the eligible courses (see (1) Eligibility requirements) to receive their scholarship payment as per Conditions.
5. Conditions of Scholarship	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Participants must achieve a minimum course (cumulative) Grade Point Average (GPA) of 5.50/7.00 in any given semester/teaching period to maintain the Scholarship for the next study period. Special circumstances will be taken into consideration to support individual variation to the Conditions of scholarship. Supporting documentary evidence may be requested. The Participants are encouraged to discuss their special circumstance with QUT Scholarships scholarships@qut.edu.au or Counselling services. Progression: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Participants whose course (cumulative) GPA drops below 5.50 are issued a notification that they are in breach of their scholarship condition but will continue to receive their payment for the currently enrolled semester/teaching period. If their course (cumulative) GPA remains below 5.50 for the following semester/teaching period, payment may be

	<p>suspended until further notice.</p> <p>c. A third breach of the GPA condition may result in termination of the Scholarship.</p> <p>6. Deferment of the Scholarship offer is not permitted.</p> <p>7. Scholarship payments are suspended whilst a student is on an approved Leave of Absence. After completing their first semester/teaching period, the Participants can apply for up to two years Leave of Absence from their course without impacting their scholarship.</p> <p>8. Participants who withdraw from their studies prior to completion of the semester/teaching period (i.e., no grades are recorded) may be required to return monies paid.</p> <p>9. Participants on the David Klingberg Memorial Scholarship cannot concurrently receive another merit, cooperative, or industry scholarship, but are eligible to receive a bursary, prize, or equity scholarship, while being a industry the Participant.</p> <p>10. Unsuccessful Participants:</p> <p>a. QUT's decision in the awarding of a scholarship will be final.</p> <p>b. QUT is not liable for any:</p> <p>i. indirect or consequential loss; and</p> <p>ii. any loss of revenue, loss of profit or loss of business opportunities, suffered by the student in connection with the Scholarship process whether under contract, tort (including negligence) or otherwise.</p> <p>10. The Participant accepts the Scholarship by doing the following:</p> <p>a. Accept the Scholarship offer and agree to the declaration and terms and Conditions in the online scholarship offer acceptance form by the date specified.</p> <p>b. Provide QUT with bank details.</p> <p>11. If the Participant does not accept the Scholarship by the date specified in the offer letter, the Participant will forfeit the Scholarship and QUT reserves the right to allocate the Scholarship to someone else.</p>
6. Under 18	<p>1. If the Participant is under the age of 18 years, the Participant will be deemed to have obtained the permission of the Participant's parent or legal guardian to participate in the Scholarship application process and the Scholarship award and to be bound by these terms.</p>
7. General requirements for application terms	<p>Where an application is required:</p> <p>1. All applications become the property of QUT upon submission, upload or otherwise.</p> <p>2. Applications must be received by QUT during the application period.</p> <p>3. A student claiming to be the Participant must provide proof of identity, if required by QUT.</p> <p>4. Each the Participant may be required to sign a document indicating they have received their scholarship payment at the time of payment.</p> <p>5. Any decision of QUT, the Scholarship sponsor or donor, in respect of all matters arising out of, or in connection with, the Scholarship is final and binding and no correspondence will be entered into. See Grievances (9) below for information on appeals.</p>

Each Participant is responsible for notifying QUT of any change to the Participants contact details during the application process and after the Scholarship has been awarded. 7. If this scholarship process is interfered with in any way or is not capable of being conducted as anticipated due to any reason beyond reasonable control of QUT, QUT reserves the right, in its sole discretion to modify, suspend, terminate, or cancel the Scholarship, as appropriate. 8. This scholarship and these terms are governed by the laws of Queensland.
8. Termination of scholarship	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The university reserves the right to cease a scholarship in the following circumstances: 2. Failure to comply with the Conditions (5) of the Scholarship. 3. Withdrawal from your course. The Participants are advised to contact scholarships@qut.edu.au, Faculty, or Counselling services before withdrawing from their course. 4. Failure to enrol into a course following the completion of the approved deferral period. 5. Participants who commence a degree at another university will not be eligible for the Scholarship upon their return from deferment. 6. Failure to enrol into a course following the completion of the approved Leave of Absence period. 7. Student behaviour that breaches the QUT Student Code of Conduct, where if proven would be regarded as student misconduct. The required standards of behaviour relate to policies regarding Academic integrity (MOPP C/5.3), QUT Code for responsible conduct of research (MOPP D/2.6), Acceptable use of information technology resources (MOPP F/1.11).
9. Grievances	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Participants should initially contact the Scholarships team to see if they can resolve any issues before lodging a formal appeal. Contact the team at scholarships@qut.edu.au. 2. Participants may lodge a formal appeal arising from any scholarship matter through the Appeals Committee. 3. Any grievances related to the administration of scholarships are governed by E/9.2 Grievance resolution procedures for student related grievances, with QUT's Manual of Policy and Procedures.
10. Privacy	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. By applying for the Scholarship, you are providing permission for your details to be shared with the selection paStudnel. QUT collects the personal information on the Scholarship application form to assess your scholarship/bursary application and for other university purposes upon enrolment. The collection is authorised under the QUT Student Rules. 11. Reserving the right to amend	<p>Without limiting any part of the Scholarship terms QUT may:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Amend or replace these terms and conditions, or any scholarship rules or procedures, at any time and for any reason. 2. Extend, suspend, or terminate the Scholarship/scholarship process at any time before it is awarded. 3. Accept applications after the due date. 4. At any time prior to award, disqualify any student from participating or exclude its offer from further consideration. 5. Commence a new process for calling applications on a similar or different basis to that outlined in these terms. 6. Use non QUT personnel in assessing applications.
